Re: Mark Hajdu and Jennifer Hajdu

To the Public Integrity Unit of the Dallas County District Attorney:

On behalf of Kristy Noble, Chair of the Dallas County Democratic Party, I am referring this matter to your office for investigation.

As set out in the attached documentation, Mark Hajdu, during the current election cycle, filed an application to run for State Representative in the 114th District. At the time he filed, he well knew that he did not live in that district and was therefore ineligible to hold that office. His wife, Jennifer, head of the county Republican party, approved his application even though she well knew that he was ineligible to hold that office.

Filing that fraudulent application subsequently allows the Republicans to wait until the primary was decided so they can cherry pick a Republican candidate they deem most suitable to run against the Democratic nominee.

Filing a false application for office constitutes Tampering with a Government Document, under penal code section 37.10(a)(1). Falsely confirming eligibility to run aids and abets that offense.

With this submission I have included a thorough timeline of the events, a legal memorandum regarding the offense of tampering in the context of an election application, and, most importantly, a copy of the false filing.

Election fraud is a serious matter. It is inconceivable that the Hajdus—one a Republican precinct chair and the other the head of the local party--did not know what voting district they lived in. But for this blatant manipulation of the filing deadlines, there would be no Republican candidate in this race.

I ask that you give this matter prompt attention due to the upcoming election deadlines.
